



Clarendon County Special Called Meeting Monday, September 25, 2018, 9:30 AM Council Chambers

Chairman Stewart called the meeting to order at 9:30 am with a prayer. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited in unison

1. Clarendon County Transportation Committee (CCTC)

Chairman Stewart stated that the CCTC was now in session. The CCTC meeting began at 9:32 am.

Administrator Epperson presented Council with a request for additional funding in the amount of \$65,824 to complete the work on Benton Road. He stated that the additional funding would come out of the 25% C-Funds allotted to the County for road repairs. He continued by stating that the reason for the Special Called meeting is because the additional funding must be approved by October 2, 2018.

On motion by Vice Chairman Frierson and Seconded by Councilman English, Council voted unanimous approval to the request for the CCTC for additional funding in the amount of \$65,824 to complete the work on Benton Road.

Chairman Stewart stated that the CCTC would now close. The CCTC closed at 9:34 pm.

2. Hurricane Florence Update

Administrator Epperson presented Council with a update on Hurricane Florence. He stated that we dodged a large bullet. He continued by stating that Clarendon County did not receive a lot of

damages therefore; no public assistance for individuals were requested from FEMA. Administrator Epperson further stated that Sumter County nor Williamsburg County requested public assistance.

Administrator Epperson stated that the County spent \$28,000 on protective services preparing for Hurricane Florence and if approved, the County would be reimbursed 75% of those fees. He concluded his update by stating that the Gym and the Breedin Room at the Weldon Auditorium has a Generator and there is a room set up for Emergency Services that would allow E-911 to operate out of that facility if needed.


3. Adjourn
